Three Mississauga athletes turned in double gold performances to help Mississauga Track and Field Club finish first at the provincial indoor championships in Windsor.

Several other Mississauga competitors won gold medals as well at the Ontario Track and Field Association's (OTFA) Indoor Championships, held March 5-6 in Windsor.

The best previous finish for the Mississauga Club was a second-place showing in 2003.

Mississauga totalled 212 points (all divisions combined) to lead the overall standings. Niagara Olympics finished second with 187 points.

Athletes competed in Senior (open age), Junior (under-19), Juvenile (under-17), Midget (under-15) and Under-14 categories.

Mississauga Track and Field Club won the Junior and Juvenile titles, and placed second in the Senior division.

Winning double gold were:

Kate Van Buskirk in the Senior Women's 3,000 metres (10:01.70) and Junior Women's 1,500m (4:35.06);

Tyrone Halstead in the Juvenile Boys' 60m (7.02 seconds) and Juvenile Boys' 200m (22.97 seconds); and Rhonda Kay Trusty in the Juvenile Girls' 60m (7.68 seconds) and Juvenile Girls' 200m (25.20 seconds).

Other Mississauga gold medalists were:

Erica Broomfield in the Senior Women's 60m (7.38 seconds);

Anson Henry in the Senior Men's 60m (6.66 seconds);

Cameron Sahadath in the Senior Men's 60m hurdles (8.26 seconds); Jordan Davis in the Junior Men's 400m (50.04 seconds); and Gavin Smellie in the Junior Men's 200m (22.16 seconds).

Winning silver medals were:

Athena McBean in the Juvenile Girls' 60m (7.84 seconds) and 200m (25.83 seconds);

Marc Latouche in the Junior Men's 200m (22.23 seconds); Smellie in the Junior Men's 60m (7.09 seconds); Kawani Simon in the Senior Men's 800m (1:54.63);

Robert Koziarski in the Juvenile Boys' 1,500m (4:12.92); and Spencer McGillicuddy in the Midget Boys' 3,000m (10:08.07).

Bronze medalists were:

Asha James in the Senior Women's 60m (7.63 seconds);

Cordell Morrison in the Junior Men's 60m (7.10 seconds); and Luke Christie in the Junior Men's 400m (52.11 seconds).
